St. Francesca's Pregnancy and Family Support Program is a "Earn While You Learn" type program ... and the program is free of charge.

They offer a number of video topics that cover various areas of parenting from pregnancy to birth to infant care, toddler care, parenting skills, life enrichment skills, fatherhood lessons, positive partnerships, special circumstances such as abuse, addiction, codependency, etc.

With each topic you learn about, you earn credits that can be used to "purchase" items such as maternity and baby clothes, blankets, diapers, formula, car seats, gas cards and other much needed parenting supplies.

This is a faith-based program and they currently have 21 moms in the program, with room for more. It is designed to educate, support and create interest to continue with the program with the "Earn While You Learn" incentive. They also connect the moms in the program with other moms going through similar circumstances so they have a support group in the program.

Rescued and Redeemed is a 501c3 Christ-centered, anti-sex trafficking organization located in Eau Claire, started in 2018. It currently is the only Rescued and Redeemed program in the state of Wisconsin.

They focus on confronting this issue by providing deeper awareness and practical, effective solutions that rescue and redeem all involved individuals through the love and gospel of Jesus Christ.

Their mission is three-fold ... #1. REACHING vulnerable people through awareness and education. #2. RESCUING victims by protecting them and providing hope and healing. #3. RESTORING survivors through effective solutions, services and support.

They help survivors of sex trafficking reclaim their lives and find healing through their survivor's services which cover everything from advocacy to safe shelter. They also bring a deeper understanding and awareness of the root issues that lead individuals into activities and mindsets that can potentially result in sex trafficking by providing preventative resources and mentorship opportunities.

One of their methods of support is an on-going clothing drive with all items collected distributed around the world for those in need. They also offer short-term clothing drives.
